"Slow down! Stop! Be quiet! This is Advent!"

Those words literally shouted at me from the page of a devotional booklet given to me by a friend a number of years ago. I wrote them on an index card and carried them with me for the entirety of Advent that year. Given all that has transpired in our world, our nation, our parish community and our own lives over the past few months, these directives are particularly timely for this Advent season.

Slowing down affords us, at the very least, an opportunity to pay attention to the gifts of our families and friends – the relationships that sustain us through the joys and challenges of life. Could we slow down long enough to write a note (with real ink on real paper in our own handwriting!) of appreciation to someone we love?

Stopping our hyperactive busy-ness, provides us with an important reminder that human beings weren't intended to live on adrenaline alone! Could we simply cease our activity for a minute or two each day, become aware of our own pulse, feel the gift of life that courses through us, and offer a quick prayer of thanksgiving? (A simple, "Thank you, God!" will do nicely, I think.)

Being quiet, unplugging ourselves from our electronic gadgetry brings us to the awareness that much of what passes for communication and entertainment drives us further and further away from our own spiritual center. Could we risk being quiet with our own thoughts for three minutes a day? How long has it been since we listened to our own souls?

This is Advent – the season of preparation. We are preparing to welcome the Gift of God's Own Self,

clothed in human flesh. We are preparing to celebrate the mystery of Emmanuel – "God with us". Our holy labor of hopeful preparation can only begin when we slow down, stop and get quiet.

Advent Collections



This year Trinity will spread the joy and blessings of Advent by collecting items needed by two nonprofit organizations in our community. Fr. Gene's Help Center strives to provide dignity through donating

clothing to people in need in the Milwaukee area.

They are asking us to help them with warm gloves, new or gently used children's boots, large sized bras for women, and monetary donations to be used to buy warm parkas for men. Checks should be written to Trinity with Fr. Gene's on the memo line.

As many people even in our community continue to need food, we will also collect healthy non-perishable items for the Wauwatosa Food Pantry. These items include tuna, peanut butter, canned soup, canned fruit, canned vegetables, canned stew, canned beans, whole grain pasta, brown rice, pasta sauce, cereal, nuts, juice and boxed milk.

You will be able to pick up a sticker to remind you what to shop for on the library windows starting November 20.



Tips regarding 2022 Yearend Contributions From Beth Vogel, Treasurer

*If possible, please pay your remaining pledge before year end. contribution or received on before December 31, 2022, will be reported on your 2022 Contribution Statement, and, therefore, can be used as a 2022 tax deduction. The 2022 Contribution Statements will be sent out the last week in January 2023.

*To be sure any year-end contributions are credited for 2022 tax purposes, the contribution must be at the church no later than Saturday, December 31, 2022. If no one is in the office, just drop the contribution through the mail slot. The mail slot is located east of the parking lot doors. If you drop it in the mail; it needs to be postmarked on or before December 31st.

*Please indicate on your check to what account the contribution should credited (i.e., prepaid 2023 pledge, 2022 pledge, Christmas flowers, Christmas offering, memorials, weekly flowers, rector's discretionary account, etc.) If you have any questions, contact the church office, and leave a message for Barbara Thompson, Financial Secretary, or Beth Vogel, Treasurer. 
NAME TAGS
