

**SCRIP** is a gift card purchase program where Trinity Church receives a percentage of each purchased card. For example Pick and Save cards yield a 4% return. Jill Paradowski orders \$400 a month for grocery shopping and Trinity Church receives \$16 from the purchase of the cards. If we would all work together

to purchase even one card a month the total profit each month would be higher. The profits from the cards are shared three times a year with The Gathering, The Wauwatosa food pantry and the Rector's discretionary fund. In 2023, each ministry received almost \$1,000. Here is how you can help: Pick up an order form from the pillar outside the parish library. Choose to purchase a card or two. Complete the form and include your check or cash in the designated envelope. Orders are placed the Monday following the first Sunday of the month. The purchased cards are ready for you to pick up the following Sunday. Please speak with Jill Paradowski if you have questions regarding this SCRIP program. The next order dates are: January 7, February 4, March 3 and April 7.



#### **Anti Racism Study Group**

In the December 14th issue of the Episcopal News Service "ENS", David Paulsen wrote about a church in Charleston, South Carolina that learned of a racist event which took place in 1919 just blocks from their church. In response, the parish conducted further research and a historic marker was erected.

"A 1919 riot in which white sailors in Charleston, South Carolina, attacked black businesses and residents, killing two, was little known to many in the congregation at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church despite the 200-year-old church's downtown location blocks from where the historic violence started.

Then last year, several dozen St. Stephen's parishioners and members of other downtown congregations embarked on a civil rights pilgrimage. They traveled to sites in Alabama that were significant in the fight against racial segregation and discrimination in the 1950s and 1960s, such as the 16th Street Baptist

Church in Birmingham and the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma." You can read the whole story by visiting Episcopal News Service "ENS" and searching for the December 14th issue.

Why would I choose to draw attention to this article? For me, there are two take-away's.

One is the important example St. Stephen's parishioners set. By not turning away from past acts of racial violence in their neighborhood, they made space for others to learn about this difficult example of racism, and hopefully take a step toward a better understanding of the need for healing and reconciliation.

The second is the reference to the civil rights pilgrimage which St. Stephen's parishioners undertook. A number of us in the anti racist study group, along with our rector, have a desire to make a similar trip. To that end, I would invite anyone who is potentially interested in such a pilgrimage to let me know. An inquiry is not a commitments but it would be good to get a sense of how many might be interested in such a journey. details have not yet been fleshed out, but tentatively this would be a 4-5 day excursion, after Easter but before temperatures make visiting the south untenable.
